DONATIONS

Mr. Mike Van Orden, Director of Teaching and Learning, and members of the Middle School Science Adoption Committee shared an overview of the process used to develop a recommendation for the adoption of a Gr. 6-8 Science Textbook. The Committee reviewed research and standards and developed rubrics to use for the evaluation of various science curricula. These rubrics included: Best Practice Alignment, Standards Alignment, Assessment Alignment, Organization and Design, and Digital Resources.

This year, the Committee heard presentations from publishers, evaluated curricula for middle school science using rubrics, piloted materials in classrooms, and narrowed options to a final recommendation for each subject. The district's Instructional Materials Committee reviewed these materials and recommended them for adoption at its April 15 meeting.

An opportunity was provided for public review and comment of instructional materials under consideration for adoption and to give written feedback. Materials were on display outside of the Curriculum Library at the Resource Center from April 11-29.

The Committee members showed examples of how the textbook will provide differential learning, illustrate key concepts and vocabulary throughout the lessons, and provide additional resources such as video links and online resources. They talked about the differences in the current curriculum and the recommended curriculum. They highlighted why this textbook was selected and how it aligns with the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS).

Teachers will have multiple options to participate in professional development in science standards, proficiency scales, and curriculum materials in June and August. Training in the science standards and collaboration time to learn and implement the new materials will be provided throughout the 2016-17 school year.

Teacher and student materials will be bar-coded and entered into the district textbook inventory system during the summer.

The curriculum materials will be implemented in the 2016-17 school year.

Dr. Pierce related that as of Friday, April 29, the district's bond measure was passing by 66.28%. These numbers will continue to be updated. On behalf of the board, staff, and students, she thanked the community for their support to ensure that the district can reduce overcrowding and improve learning environments for our students. She related that reports will be provided to our community on the plan and how the district will be accountable to use those resources.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT -

Dr. Pierce continued and related that community engagement and parent involvement has been a focus of the district. A survey will be sent out to parents next week and she encouraged parents to complete the survey. The results of the survey will be able to assist the district in the strategic work that will be implemented. This information can help the district make improvements based on the input received.

The board members again thanked the community for their support. Siri Bliesner thanked everyone for their extraordinary efforts. Mark Stuart noted that this demonstrated that education is a priority in our community. Nancy Bernard echoed her appreciation and thanked everyone for their involvement.
