Dr. Pierce highlighted the steps taken since the November 6 board meeting. Numerous questions were raised by the board and parents and responses were provided. In addition, the boundary committee reconvened to review the information and additional feedback that was received. After further analysis and discussion, the boundary committee re-confirmed agreement on their final boundary recommendation and did not recommend any changes to the Superintendent as presented at the November 6 board meeting.

The final recommendation included the following information:

- Boundary adjustments for new and current Redmond area elementary schools
- Boundary adjustments for new and current Redmond area middle schools
- Boundary adjustments for Redmond and Eastlake high schools
- Recommendation for program locations for elementary and middle school Quest and Choice Schools/Programs
- Recommendation for grandfathering and variance

Nancy Bernard moved to approve the Superintendent's recommendation regarding boundary adjustments, program changes, grandfathering, and variances for the Redmond area elementary and middle schools. Elementary school attendance areas will be implemented beginning with the 2018-2019 school year. Middle school attendance areas will be implemented beginning in the 2019-2020 school year. High school attendance areas will be implemented

beginning with incoming 9<sup>th</sup> grade students in the 2019-2020 school year. Seconded by Eric Laliberte.

Board members asked additional questions.

Chris Carlson noted that this has been a very thorough boundary process and thanked staff for their time and efforts. He appreciated the provisions to provide grandfathering options to students and their families. Siri Bliesner thanked the community for their engagement and feedback provided continuously throughout this process.

Motion carried.

Matt Manobianco, Associate Superintendent, Student & Professional Learning Services, presented a program report on Professional Learning.

Barbara Posthumus, Associate Superintendent, Business and Support Services, provided a report on enrollment and demographics.

Dr. Pierce conveyed that Nancy Bernard will be stepping off the board after serving 20 years, 1997-2017. She thanked Nancy for her wisdom and the legacy of service that she left behind. She has given countless hours to the district. Dr. Pierce expressed her appreciation for Nancy's dedication and commitment to the students, families, and staff in our communities. Board members echoed Dr. Pierce's sentiments and thanked Nancy for her service.

Siri Bliesner requested time be set aside at the December 4 board meeting to further review and discuss ER 2-3, Mathematics. Board consensus was to place this item on the non-consent agenda for the December 4 board meeting.
